COVID 19 POLICY



for summer camp 2023

Overview:

- Anyone who is feeling unwell or experiencing COVID-19 symptoms must stay home.
- All participants are encouraged to bring a mask for public transit and restrooms.
- Frequent hand hygiene will be part of the daily schedule.
- Instructors will keep physical contact with participants to a minimum (ie hand-holding).
- Only necessary personal belongings should be brought to camp.
- Personal belongings must be kept organized and properly stored.
- There will be no sharing of food, drinks, or other personal items.
- Participants must use water bottles and avoid drinking directly from fountains.

Management of suspected COVID-19 case at camp:

- Symptomatic participants will be separated from the rest of the campers until they can go home. Staff will supervise while keeping a 2m+ distance.
- Environmental cleaning/disinfecting of the space and items used by the participant/staff will be conducted once the person has left the program.
- Other campers/staff who were present or in close proximity to the person who became ill will be asked to take an at-home COVID test.
- Participants who test positive for COVID-19 must be excluded from the camp program until they test negative twice within 48 hours.
- Campers/staff awaiting test results should be excluded from camp.
